Summary: The Family Partnership Advocate implements the Family Partnership Campaign within the Service Area.

Reports To: Community Organizer, Membership Specialist, and regional Fund Development Professional

Responsibilities:

- Become knowledgeable of GSCIs' Family Partnership Campaign (FPC) and promotional materials.
- Share GSCIs' funding needs with troop leaders and families.
- Serve as a liaison between the Service Area and GSCI.
- Ensure that all troops have the opportunity to contribute to the Family Partnership Campaign through various year-round activities and events.
- Meet with the Membership Specialist and/or Fund Development Professional to brainstorm ideas for making the Family Partnership Campaign a success within the Service Area.
- Keep record of troops and families participating in the Family Partnership Campaign within the Service Area and communicate participation levels to GSCI.
- Attend Service Area, Service Team, and council-sponsored meetings as requested.

Position Competencies:

- Be guided in all actions by the Girl Scout Mission, Promise, and Law.
- Remain informed about and comply with the most current policies, procedures, and guidelines of Girl Scouts of Central Illinois and Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA).
- Must become a registered member of GSUSA and successfully complete the volunteer application process.
- Ability to keep legible, accurate and detailed records.
- Knowledge of GSCI's Family Partnership Campaign and promotional materials.
- Knowledge of communities within the Service Area and willingness to network to promote the Family Partnership Campaign.

Qualifications and Core Competencies:

1. **Girl Focus:** Fosters girl-adult partnerships, providing opportunities for girl-leadership development.
2. **Adaptability:** Adjusts own behavior and remains flexible and tolerant in response to changing situations and environments, unexpected obstacles, or diverse people expressing different perspectives, needs, or demands.
3. **Fostering Diversity:** Acknowledges the bases of individual differences (cultural, socioeconomic, global, etc.) in decisions and actions and is able to negotiate across these differences.
4. **Oral Communication:** Communicates in a manner appropriate for the individual or group.
5. **Personal Integrity:** Demonstrates dependability, honesty, and credibility.
